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# APPLICATION FORM (Summer 2020, Fall 2020, and Spring 2021)

The RIC World Connection Fund is a merit-based award offered through the RIC Study Abroad program in collaboration with the Office of Student Financial Aid.

In order to be eligible to the RIC World Connection Scholarship, you must:

- ♦ Be an American citizen or a Permanent Resident of the United States,
- ♦ Be enrolled at Rhode Island College as an undergraduate student,
- ♦ Have a minimum G.P.A. of 2.5,
- ◆ Be in compliance with the RIC study abroad requirements: a minimum of three semesters (one semester minimum for transfer students) completed at Rhode island College before your study abroad term,
- ♦ Be in good standing with RIC,
- Register to an approved study abroad degree-seeking program that has at least half time equivalent enrollment.

### Applications are due on Friday, March 20 2020 by 12:00 pm (E.S.T.).

Applications must include all required material and be dropped off at the Office of Study Abroad (Gaige Hall 121) or emailed at studyabroad@ric.edu. Any incomplete or late applications will be automatically disqualified.

#### **Application Requirements**

Your application must include:

#### 1. AN ESSAY

This essay has to be a two-page typed document (between 500 and 600 words). Please print your essay out and attach it to the end of your application, clearly labeled with your full name on each page.

Guidelines for the essay:

- Introduce yourself. Include your personal history and studies at RIC as well as any other institutions you have attended if you are a Transfer Student. Specify if you are part of an underrepresented community (i.e. minorities and/or LGBTQ+ individuals), a first-generation student and/or if there are any personal, familial or specific circumstances regarding your financial position.
- Explain the way your experience abroad fits into your academic and career goals by giving details about the country and the program you chose. Mention why you have come to these decisions, including why you became interested in studying abroad in the first place.
- What challenges do you think you will face when traveling abroad? Provide examples of how you plan to overcome these problems.

Please attach to the end of your application two letters of Recommendation from Rhode Island College faculty members on the appropriate Rhode Island College letterhead stationery.
