GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS: The following requirements must be completed by undergraduate degree candidates at Rhode Island College in order to graduate:

- General Education requirements
- College Math Competency (completed at CCRI; this is separate from the Gen Ed math requirement)
- Academic Major
- Second Language requirement (completed at CCRI)
- Minimum of 120 credits, with a minimum of 45 taken at RIC with a minimum of 15 credits in the major; 12 at 300/400 level
- Minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 plus a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 in your major and minor.
