Dear Friends of Research @ RIC:

This past fiscal year, 2015, marks the fifth year that Rhode Island College's Office of Research and Grants Administration (ORGA) features the college's funded research activities with an annual report. We're proud to have participated in the growth in research capacity taking place across our campus. This

report highlights some of the year's research accomplishments by our faculty, staff and students.

Activity in sponsored research and programs is typically described in terms of dollars generated and similar data. This report makes clear that fiscal year 2015 was a banner year for Research @ RIC. However, this year also shows increased research activity through the numbers of proposals submitted and Principal Investigators involved. In those two categories, the college surpassed all previous years, with 51 Principal Investigators submitting 108 proposals. This is genuine growth!

Dr. Nancy Carriuolo highlights the accomplishments of faculty in securing external funding during the 2015 fiscal year.


\$9,780,944 with more than \$947,441 of that total supporting indirect costs associated with grant-funded projects.

Of the **45** Pls receiving awards, **10** were NEW Pls.


RIC's faculty and staff submitted 108 proposals totaling \$17,418,766 in FY 2015 funding requests. This represented almost a one million dollar increase in proposals from FY 2014 and a record high, thanks to the innovation and commitment of our **Principal Investigators**.





"Research is an integral part of the process of learning for undergraduate education in chemistry" said Dr. Leung. "Knowledge generation is happening rapidly and it is important for students to understand the process of disseminating, analyzing, organizing, and reporting, then how to make changes or adjustments based on new data. Many things are being discovered every day and it is crucial for students to understand the scientific process, which is a form of critical thinking that is applicable to life and work." According to Dr. Leung, whether students end up in chemistry as a vocation or not, this and other research opportunities help to hone such skills and to cultivate an open

and curious outlook that will sustain

them for a lifetime.
