PSCE Fiscal Year 2018 Programming Report for Continuing Education

PSCE units and programs in fiscal year 2018 included Continuing Education, Summer Sessions, Early Spring Session, Faculty-Led Travel, Workforce Development/Adult Education, Healthy Jobs RI, Real Jobs RI, RI STEAM Center, ESL Intensive and ExCEL Programs and various community programs. Programs no longer associated with PSCE in 2018 and omitted from this report include Career Development Center, Economic and Leadership Development, Central Falls Parent College, Sustainability Programs, Langevin Center for Design, Innovation and Advanced Manufacturing.

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The fiscal year 2018 report includes data for nine PSCE programs that provided some form of continuing education (CE), workforce development (WD/AE), professional development (PD), personal enrichment and/or cultural/community programming. In addition, the 2018 report includes data on the Institute for Education in Healthcare programs and the School of Social Work programs in Continuing Education in Social Work and the Certificate of Continuing Study in Adoption and Foster Care. All CE courses and programs are offered in cooperation with RIC schools, departments and programs. A list of our current degree, certificate, non-credit and community programming is provided on the next page.

RIC's CE, PD, WD/AE and community programs serve adult students, immigrants and undocumented refugees, unemployed and underemployed members of the workforce, nurses, PreK-12 teachers and administrators, social workers, childcare providers, English language learners and managers and supervisors in the public and private sectors. Cultural and community initiatives include conference and event programming on issues and topics related to STEAM initiatives and financial literacy PD for K-12 teachers.

PSCE overall growth in fiscal years 2012 to 2018 and changes in associated programs and programming make time series data on CE enrollment and revenue mostly unreliable. A trend in significantly increasing revenue and enrollment in fiscal years 2012-2015 has been replaced with trend in moderately decreasing revenue and enrollment since 2015. Fluctuations in PSCE programs and programming does account some of the changes in FY 2018 data.

Revenue growth over the last ten years has been due in large part to delivery of existing RIC degree and certificate programs as CE and RIC has room to grow in this area. However, PSCE has also carved out a role as a leader in contextualized adult education training and bridge-to-careers/bridge to degree candidacy programs, and our adult education programs increased significantly in fiscal year 2018. Institute for Education in Healthcare non-credit programs for incumbent workers in healthcare have added to our leadership in adult education programming.

Total enrollment in all FY 2018 PSCE programming (excluding Summer Sessions) was down 34% to 4,852 and total gross revenue was down 18% to \$994,494. Enrollment in CE courses and PD and WD training programs was down 14% to 2,352.

PSCE continues to make support and expansion of programming and services a priority; however PSCE continues to lack business and administrative software and processes to provide industry-leading support services and data capture, recording and management for all programming.


