Comments: These proposals aim to make several changes to the Gender and Woman's Study program (both major and minor) to better streamline the programs and ensure the students are taking an effective selection of courses

(the AFRI elective has been broadened to allow for other ethnicities, and ENGL 326 African-American Literature and FNED 346 Schooling in a Democratic Society have been added). Previous categories that were confusing have been consolidated and various 3 credit GEND courses will be raised to 4 credits to allow for better continuity between requirements. #010 also raises the numbering of GEND 300, to 400, to ensure students take it at the proper time, and changes its title to Internship (from Field Experience). Also there is a request to have the two foundation courses require a minimum of C for program retention. The credit count for the major will go from 33-39 to 38-40, and the minor will remain at 18-20.
