## In the News at EEP

#### **EEP Continues to Expand**

Rhode Island public and private school students and Massachusetts public school students continue, in increasing numbers, to take advantage of the opportunity to experience college level coursework and earn valuable college credits, while in high school. The participation numbers for the 2016-2017 school year include:

40 Rhode Island public schools

4 Rhode Island private schools

5 Massachusetts public schools

50 college courses offered through RIC/EEP

3,000+ students registered for fall and spring classes

Thousands of college credits have been earned, giving those students a valuable head start in their college careers.

## **New EEP Registration Process for 2017-2018**

Prospective EEP students will need to <u>create a MyRIC user account</u> to begin the process for EEP course registration. There are major advantages in having students create their own account online including more accuracy in demographic data (frequent illegible handwriting on paper forms), reducing time to register students (currently a double process for our assistant) and providing students with a real college experience.

Students who will be taking an EEP Course for the <u>FIRST TIME</u> will need to create a user account. The link will be on the EEP web page later in June, but this existing link can be used now: <u>www.ric.edu/recordsoffice/registration.php</u>

For the first time, EEP students will be given a Student ID number and a RIC email account. It is very important that students save their ID number—they will need it in the fall when EEP course registration begins. We plan on most course registrations occurring in very early fall, with an earlier deadline for final registrations (more to come).

**IMPORTANT:** Students who have already taken EEP courses **DO NOT** have to create a user account. All former EEP students will receive a letter from the college in June which will include their **Student ID number**, user name and instructions on how to access their new email account. The EEP office will use EEP students' RIC email address for communications.
