North Kingstown Teacher Honored as Financial Educator of the Year

Richard Garland of North Kingstown High School was named Financial Literacy Educator of the Year for 2016-2017. Rhode Island State Treasurer Seth Magaziner presented the award to Mr. Garland during a ceremony at the high school last spring. In 2012 Mr. Garland was the first high school teacher approved to teach Finance 230 in EEP.

According to an article in the ERSRI newsletter, the "award recognizes teachers who excel in and out the classroom to provide their students with the financial literacy skills they need to successfully navigate our complex financial system."

Mr. Garland had many years of experience in the private business sector before he began teaching at North Kingstown in 2012, and he uses that successful experience to enlighten and motivate his

students. In addition to his teaching responsibilities, Mr. Garland is advisor the school's Business Club and prepares students to compete in the Jump\$tart RI Personal Literacy Challenge.

New EEP Account Creation Process

An online account creation process was launched this fall for high school students who planned to take EEP courses (or a course on campus). Students went online and entered their demographic data, including high school, to create their own MyRIC account. Students then received their 7-digit RIC ID, which they needed to complete the paper registration form.

This process allowed students to have a more realistic college experience and also greatly reduced the data entry workload in the EEP office, which allowed for more timely reporting of data to the Office of the Postsecondary Commissioner and RIDE.

With any new process, we expect issues to arise, and this was no exception. A few students thought creating an account meant they had actually registered for an EEP course. Most issues were typos in names or issues with social security numbers. We got through it with your assistance and patience, so we thank you. Working with our MIS team, we are hoping to launch Phase II next fall, which would allow students to register themselves for their EEP classes. Stay tuned!

Over 2,600 RI public high school students and 200 private school and MA students have been enrolled and are earning college credits through EEP.

Please note that for classes beginning in the second semester, only students who have not already created a MyRIC account will be required to do so before completing the paper registration form.
