Attention On-sites: Registration Challenges

Importance of legible registration forms

One of the biggest challenges for the EEP staff is deciphering students' handwriting on their registration forms. This results in many calls to high schools to confirm a name, address, date of birth or graduation year. It is important that our data entry be accurate to ensure that students are registered and graded correctly for their EEP courses. We need your help!

Beginning this fall, we ask that you implement the following with your instructors:

- Please ask your EEP instructors to provide a typed alphabetized list of the students who register for their EEP class(es). This may even be a printed copy of the class roster with the EEP registrants checked off.
- Ask them to check that students have listed the year they were born and the year they will graduate from high school. Some students list their birthday (March 1, *2016*) rather than their birth *year* (March 1, *1998*). Others list their current year in high school rather than their graduation year.
