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Attention M.Ed. Candidates: Changes to the Comprehensive Assessment and Exit Interviews:

Beginning with students who matriculated in the spring of 2019, and all subsequent matriculation dates, will need to enroll in the one-credit TESL 599 Graduate Essay in TESOL during the semester in which they complete the Comprehensive Assessment.

- M.Ed. students will have up to three semesters AFTER completing their coursework to complete the comprehensive assessment and exit interview.
- Comprehensive Assessment/Exit Interviews will only be offered Fall and Spring semesters, unless otherwise notified.

Interested in working towards ESL Specialist/Consultant Certificate? Individuals interested in the K-12 ESL Specialist Consultant Certification can apply to take TESL 600 ESL Program Supervision. This course prepares qualified teachers to seek this new certification from RIDE. The requirements for this course are: Graduate degree in TESOL, Bilingual Education, or related field. Minimum of three years' experience teaching emergent bilingual students. ESL Certification required. TESL 600 is offered each spring semester. January 13:	Spring registration opens for non-degree graduate students. (Those applying to the program this semester will register on this date.)

ATTENTION BILINGUAL CANDIDATES: EARN BILINGUAL AND ESL CERTIFICATION AT ONCE!

If you are proficient in a language other than English and interested in working in a Bilingual/ Dual Language Program, consider joining our Bilingual Education track in the TESL program. <u>Through our Bil.</u> <u>Ed. 7-course sequence, you can become certified in both Bilingual Education AND ESL.</u> Note that

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Bilingual Education certification requires an additional language Praxis test to show proficiency in the partner language.

GRADUATE PROGRAM REGULATIONS:

You <u>may not</u> take more than **two** courses in the M.Ed. or C.G.S. in TESOL Program without being admitted. Contact Dr. Rosa (<u>lrosa@ric.edu</u>) <u>immediately</u> if you have taken two courses and did NOT submit an application yet.

REMINDER: ALL TESOL students MUST purchase Chalk & Wire. No exceptions.

TESOL PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS FOR WHICH YOU MUST APPLY:

- M.Ed. students only: Please be aware that in order to take **the Comprehensive Assessment (Exit Portfolio)**, you must apply <u>one semester prior</u> to the semester in which you want your assessment to be read so that readers can be assigned.
- M.Ed. and C.G.S. students: Please be aware that in order to enroll in **TESL 553-Internship in TESOL** and Bilingual Education, you must complete <u>an application</u> that shows that you qualify to take the course <u>one semester prior</u> to the semester you want to take the course.
