GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS: The following requirements must be completed by undergraduate degree candidates at Rhode Island College in order to graduate:

- General Education requirements
- College Math Competency (which is separate from the Gen Ed math requirement)
- Academic Major
- A minimum of 120 credits, with a minimum of 45 taken at RIC with a minimum of 15 credits in the major (12 of which must be at the 300- or 400-level).
- A minimum overall grade point average of 2.0
- A minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 in your major and minor
