This is in collaboration with Educational Testing Services and College Board; in this role I serve on the Test Development Committee. This appointment will end in 2021, but I will continue serving in other leadership capacities afterwards.

Chief Reader Designate/Assistant, 2016-2017. These positions served as a two-year apprenticeship into the position of Chief Reader and to learn all the requirements of being the leader of the AP Human Geography exam.

Question Leader, 2013-2015. As one of four question leaders, I supervised over 100 readers, established the scoring guidelines for a portion of the exam and assisted the Chief Reader.

Lead Table Leader, 2011-2012. Under the supervision of a Question Leader, I supervised my table and assisted 5 other table leaders. Also, with the Question Leader and two other LTLs we collaboratively designed the rubric for one of the three Free Response Questions.

Table Leader, 2009-2012. Supervising 8 readers to score the APHG tests. **Reader,** 2005-2008, Scored the APHG tests.

- Rhode Island Geography Education Alliance Coordinator, 2011-2018. As the Alliance coordinator, I have worked to promote geography education throughout Rhode Island. Some of these responsibilities included the organization of workshops, presentations, conferences and other professional development opportunities for K-12 teachers and educators.
